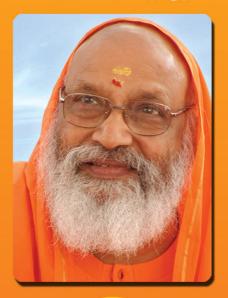

Scholarships at Swami Dayananda College of Arts & Science

Inaugurated on Vijayadasami Day, October 2013, the Swami Dayananda Scholar Program (SDSP) is designed to encourage undergraduate students to excel in their chosen field of study. The program provides students with enhanced academic and cultural opportunities, unique to their primarily agrarian socio-economic background. It is the sincere hope of the SDSP administration that the opportunities and facilities offered will encourage the development of the student both in academics as well as in their personal sphere, and bring honour to the college and our founder Pujya Swami Dayananda Saraswati.

The program administration nurtures its scholars through graduation and beyond, expanding their intellect, guiding them academically, encouraging them to experiment with education opportunities, advising them on future prospects and career options. The program also seeks to enrich its scholars by fostering integrity, leadership skills, a sense of civic - minded responsibility and academic excellence. To achieve these goals, the administration invites guest speakers, urges the students to take up additional project work and participate in seminars. The SDSP provides an atmosphere of continuous learning in which the students can discover their strengths and contribute to the growth of the rural community, the community of scholars, and the country.

The SDSP is a five semester program. In each semester, a maximum of twenty students may be selected for the program.

Eligibility

- Excellent academic record with an average of 80% in science courses and 75% in Arts & Commerce courses in each semester.
- Good written and communication skills.
- High standard of personal and professional conduct to meet with the college norms on and off campus.
- Initiative and leadership qualities.

- Short term and long term goals beyond their immediate personal growth.
- Scholars must maintain / improve their aggregate score in each semester to continue in the program.

Benefits of the SDSP

- Waiver of tuition fee 50% for aggregate scores of 80% and above in each semester for science courses; 50% for aggregate scores of 75% and above in each semester for Arts & Commerce courses.
- Preferential access to library, computer lab and net facilities of the college.
- Provision to respective faculty members to avail guidance after college hours, on all days except national holidays.

The program administration encourages students to pursue their post graduation either in Swami Dayananda College of Arts & Science or other reputed academic institutions within India by offering scholarships. They include:

- 100% of the tuition fee for the First and Second University rank holders
- $75\,\%$ of the tuition fee for the Third to Fifth University rank holders.

Scholarship Norms

- The scholarship amount will be paid each semester.
- The Head of the institution where the student is enrolled for post graduation must send a report to the Secretary of the Swami Dayananda College of Arts & Science.

The report must assess the student on

- Attendance
- Academic performance
- Attitude, ethical conduct and behaviour Initiative and leadership
- Seminar participation and details of papers presented

The student must fulfill the above norms to continue to avail of the scholarship.

Designed to encourage students to excel in their chosen field of study, there are three other scholarships offered at Swami Dayananda College of Arts & Science. They are:

- Bharat Heritage Foundation Scholarship
- GR Scholarship
- Valambal Gopala Iyer Scholarship.

Carnatic Music Classes

To reintroduce students to the region's rich dance and musical heritage, Smt.Bombay Jayashri Ramnath and her student conduct weekly carnatic music classes. Over the course of 3 years, 350 students have successfully completed and have been issued with the certificate by Hitham Trust of Chennai.

College day, Graduation Day and Annual Convention

Every year, college Annual Day and Sports day is celebrated. Prizes are distributed to students who excel in studies, sports and cultural activities. College Graduation day is held in the campus every year.

Annual conventions are conducted during January - February of the year to which invitation is extended to VIPs, guests, parents and the society.

Attendance

- The Bharathidasan University attendance regulation is followed.
- Students must ensure a minimum of 75% attendance for each semester.

Code of conduct for students

- 1. Every student should wear identity card at all times with in the campus.
- 2. Students are expected to attend classes regularly. Attendance is taken at every lecture or practical hour as prescribed in the college time table. Attendance requirements must be fulfilled by every student in each course.
- 3. Students are expected to follow the entire academic programme as outlined in the handbook. Students are expected to write all the tests and submit assignments given for each course, on time. Two internal examination and one model examination will be conducted for each paper per semester.
- 4. Every student is expected to dress simply and modestly and observe the college dress code. Students are permitted to wear: Salwar kameez/churidhars with duppata. Short kurtas, leggings are not permitted. Boys should wear formal pant and tuck-in their shirts. Jeans are not permitted.
- 5. Students are not permitted to give interviews/publish any material, participate in T.V / Radio programmes and stage shows without prior permission from the Principal.
- 6. Ragging is a serious offence. In accordance with UGC norms, ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. A student found guilty of ragging will be delt with asper the UGC Norms and Tamilnadu Government Regulations. In case you experience ragging, kindly contact the Anti-Ragging Committee for assistance.
- 7. The use of cell phones is banned on campus. Students are not permitted to use cell phones at any time or in any place on the college campus. Violation of this rule will be delt with according to government regulations resulting in termination from college.
- 8. Students are not permitted to leave the college during working hours. In case of an emergency, special permission to be sought from the Principal by due process.

- 9. Loitering is prohibited. Students are expected to keep the campus neat and clean.
- 10. Students should not damage/deface college property (chairs, benches, tables, walls etc.,). A heavy fine will be levied on students who misuse/damage college property.

Rules & Regulations for Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging

Vishaka Guidelines against Sexual Harassment at Workplace

Guidelines and norms laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Vishaka and Others Vs. State of Rajasthan and Others (JT 1997 (7) SC 384)

HAVING REGARD to the definition of 'human rights' in Section 2 (d) of the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993,

TAKING NOTE of the fact that the present civil and penal laws in India do not adequately provide for specific protection of women from sexual harassment in work places and that enactment of such legislation will take considerable time,

It is necessary and expedient for employers in work places as well as other responsible persons or institutions to observe certain guidelines to ensure the prevention of sexual harassment of women.

Duty of the Employer or other responsible persons in work places and other institutions

It shall be the duty of the employer or other responsible persons in work places or other institutions to prevent or deter the commission of acts of sexual harassment and to provide the procedures for the resolution, settlement or prosecution of acts, of sexual harassment by taking all steps required.

Definition

For this purpose, sexual harassment includes such unwelcome sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

- a) Physical contact and advances;
- b) Ademand or request for sexual favours;
- c) Sexually coloured remarks;

- d) Showing pornography;
- e) Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature

Where any of these acts is committed in circumstances where-under the victim of such conduct has a reasonable apprehension that in relation to the victim's employment or work whether she is drawing salary, or honorarium or voluntary, whether in government, public or private enterprise such conduct can be humiliating and may constitute a health and safety problem. It is discriminatory for instance when the woman has reasonable grounds to believe that her objection would disadvantage her in connection with her employment or work including recruiting or promotion or when it creates a hostile work environment. Adverse consequences might be visited if the victim does not consent to the conduct in question or raises any objection thereto.

Preventive Steps

All employers or persons in charge of work place whether in public or private sector should take appropriate steps to prevent sexual harassment. Without prejudice to the generality of this obligation they should take the following steps:

- A. Express prohibition of sexual harassment as defined above at the work place should be notified, published and circulated in appropriate ways.
- B. The Rules/Regulations of Government and Public Sector bodies relating to conduct and discipline should include rules/regulations prohibiting sexual harassment and provide for appropriate penalties in such rules against the offender.
- C. As regards private employers, steps should be taken to include the aforesaid prohibitions in the standing orders under the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946.

D. Appropriate work conditions should be provided in respect of work, leisure, health and hygiene to further ensure that there is no hostile environment towards women at work places and no employee woman should have reasonable grounds to believe that she is disadvantaged in connection with her employment.

Criminal Proceedings

Where such conduct amounts to a specific offence under the Indian Penal Code or under any other law, the employer shall initiate appropriate action in accordance with law by making a complaint with the appropriate authority.

In particular, it should ensure that victims or witnesses are not victimized or discriminated against while dealing with complaints of sexual harassment.

The victims of sexual harassment should have the option to seek transfer of the perpetrator or their own transfer.

Disciplinary Action

Where such conduct amounts to misconduct in employment as defined by the relevant service rules, appropriate disciplinary action should be initiated by the employer in accordance with those rules.

Complaint Mechanism

Whether or not such conduct constitutes an offence under law or a breach of the service rules, an appropriate complaint mechanism should be created in the employer's organisation for redress of the complaint made by the victim. Such complaint mechanism should ensure time bound treatment of complaints.

Complaints Committee

The complaint mechanism, referred to above, should be adequate to provide, where necessary, a Complaints Committee, a special counsellor or other support service, including the maintenance of confidentiality. The Complaints

Committee should be headed by a woman and not less than half of its member should be women. Further, to prevent the possibility of any undue pressure or influence from senior levels, such Complaints Committee should involve a third party, either NGO or other body who is familiar with the issue of sexual harassment.

The Complaints Committee must make an annual report to the Government department concerned of the complaints and action taken by them.

The employers and person in charge will also report on the compliance with the aforesaid guidelines including on the reports of the Complaints Committee to the Government department.

Worker's Initiative

Employees should be allowed to raise issues of sexual harassment at a workers' meeting and in other appropriate forum and it should be affirmatively discussed in Employer-Employee Meetings.

Awareness

Awareness of the rights of female employees in this regard should be created in particular by prominently notifying the guidelines (and appropriate legislation when enacted on the subject) in a suitable manner.

Third Party Harassment

Where sexual harassment occurs as a result of an act or omission by any third party or outsider, the employer and person in charge will take all steps necessary and reasonable to assist the affected person in terms of support and preventive action.

The Central/State Governments are requested to consider adopting suitable measures including legislation to ensure that the guidelines laid down by this order are also observed by the employers in Private Sector.

These guidelines will not prejudice any rights available under the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993.

Various Types of Ragging

The Hon'ble Supreme Court has, inter-alia, mentioned the following types of ragging:-

- 1. Ragging has several aspects with, among others, psychological, social, political, economic, cultural, and academic dimensions.
- 2. Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student should be considered with in the academics related aspect of ragging; similarly, exploiting the services of a junior student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of seniors is also an aspect of academics related ragging prevalent in many institutions, particularly in the technical institutions.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student by senior students should be considered an aspect of ragging for ragging economic dimensions.
- 4. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestured, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person can be put in the category of ragging with criminal dimensions.
- 5. Any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, snail-mails, blogs, public insults should be considered with in the psychological aspects of ragging. This aspect would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to others; the absence of preparing 'freshers' in the run up to their admission to higher education and life in hostels also can be ascribed as a psychological aspect of ragging coping skills in interaction with seniors or strangers can be imparted by parents as well. Any act that affects the mental health and self- confidence of students also can be described in terms of the psychological aspects of ragging.

6. The human rights perspective of ragging involves the injury caused to the fundamental right to human dignity through humiliation heaped on junior students by seniors; often resulting in the extreme step of suicide by the victims.

Actions to be taken against students for indulging and abetting in Ragging in technical institutions Universities including Deemed to be University imparting technical education:-

- The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.
- 2. Every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.
- Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following.
 - (i) Cancellation of admission
 - (ii) Suspension from attending classes
 - (iii) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
 - (iv) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
 - (v) Withholding results
 - (vi) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.

- (vii) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- (viii) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- (ix) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- (x) Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.
- 4. The institutional authority shall intimate the incidents of ragging occurred in their premises along with actions taken to the Council immediately after occurrence of such incident and inform the status of the case from time to time.
- Courts should make an effort to ensure that cases involving ragging are taken up on priority basis to send the correct message that ragging is not only to be discouraged but also to be dealt with sternness.

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

- Candidates for admission to the first year degree course should have passed the Higher Secondary Examination, conducted by the TNHSB or any other examination accepted by the University of Bharathidasan as equivalent thereto. Every candidate for admission should present his transfer certificate from the School or College which he last attended.
- 2. Students who are found to have obtained admission by false representations will be summarily dismissed with forfeiture of all fees paid.
- No student will be enrolled or permitted to attend classes until the fees due from him have been paid. This will be strictly adhered to.
- 4. The student must keep the fee receipts carefully and must produce them whenever required.
- 5. All enquiries by the students to the office will be attended to during lunch time or break time. Students are advised not to come to the office for enquiries during class hours.

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. The students of the college are to conduct themselves on and off the college premises in such a way as to maintain the reputation of the College as well as their own.
- 2. Every student should salute the members of the teaching staff on the occasion of his first meeting them for the day within the College.
- 3. On a member of the staff entering the classroom, students will rise and remain standing till he takes his seat.
- 4. No student shall leave his classroom without permission or until the teacher instruct the class to disperse.
- 5. Students are advised to cultivate the habit of reading notices posted on the college and department notice boards. Ignorance of any notice thus posted will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with it.

- 6. Smoking in the precincts of the College, spitting, throwing waste paper or rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose, are prohibited.
- 7. While moving from one classroom to another or while dispersing from a class, students should avoid making noise.
- 8. Loitering or collecting in groups anywhere within the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 9. The students should park their vehicles only in the places earmarked for them. The college will not take any responsibility for the loss and damage of any vehicle.
- 10. No student shall enter the College office, unless expressly permitted.
- Students are forbidden from joining any organisation or conducting any meeting in the college or collecting money for any purpose.
- 12. Under the Tamilnadu Government Rules, the Principal is empowered to inflict fine, withhold attendance certificates, suspend and expel a student, if considered necessary.
- 13. Ragging is strictly prohibited and is punishable by imprisonment.
- 15. Students are not supposed to use cellphones iPods in the college premises.
- 16. The students are responsible for the equipments / facilities provided in the class room. In case of damage to the property a collective fine will be levied for the entire class.
